In Fall 2001, Master of Liberal Arts was moved from the departmental location of Graduate School to Arts & Sciences in Fall 2001. Students remaining in the Graduate School departmental location category include only non-degree seeking students (non-matriculated and exchange).

In Fall 2005, LSU enrolled 2,700 visiting students whose college or university was impacted by Hurricane Katrina. Graduate students in this count are not included in this report.

In Fall 2010 the College of Arts and Sciences was renamed to College of Humanities and Social Sciences. Also, the College of Basic Sciences was renamed to College of Science.

In Fall 2012, the College of Education was merged with School of Social Work, School of Library and Information Sciences, and Human Resource Education, Child and Family Sciences, and Business Education from the College of Agriculture. The newly formed college was renamed Human Sciences and Education. Additionally, Computer Science moved from the College of Science to the College of Engineering.
